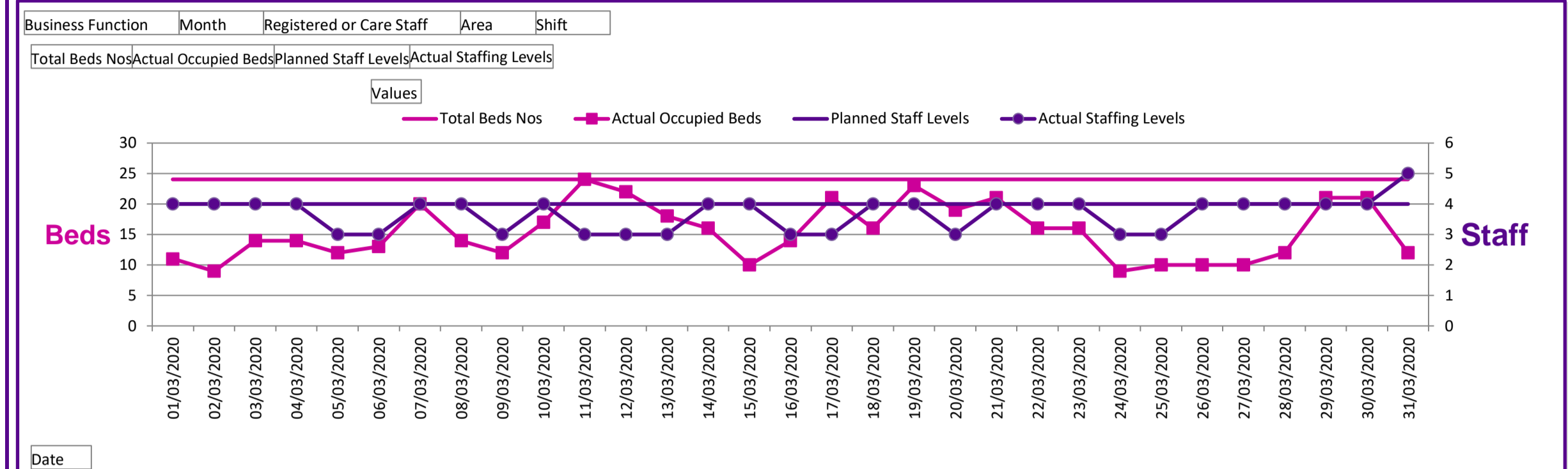

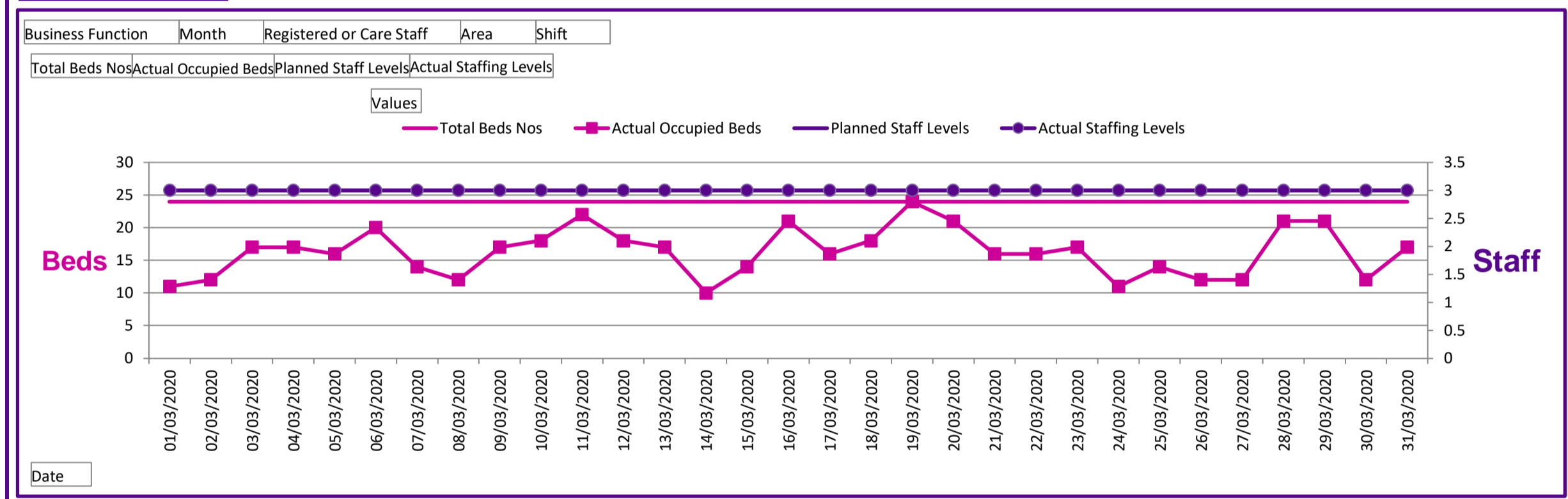

Narrative
Increased sickness rates throughout the month of March resulted in reduced Registered Nurse cover throughout the majority of March. Staff sickness relating to self isolation and symptoms relating to COVID 19. Bed occupancy has remained stable with only one incidence where all 24 beds were occupied. From 30/03/20 inpatient beds have been increase to 30 and staff uplifted to reflect the increase

Safe staffing maintained throughout the Month of march, there are currently 4 registered Nurse vacancies which do impact on the ability to fully roster shifts covered however shifts have been fully staffed with the use of bank and in the last instance agency Nurses

Staffing Concerns Gynaecology ward increased to 30 inpatient bed capacity. 5 vacancies have been filled in the last month for registered Nurses, 4 further WTE RN vacancies are currently out to advert

WTE Actual	Of the Funded WTE, the actual staffing level for the shift.
Registered	A Registered Nurse is one whom has qualified to practice as a nurse and is registered as such with the Royal college of Nursing or Royal College of Midwives
Unregistered	Unregistered staff are care staff that assist nurses with the day to day care of patients
